Dear Parents,

Welcome to first grade at Marvista. I am looking forward to meeting all of you in September. Your child will have a very enriching and exciting experience at our school next year.

Below is a list of supplies that will be needed for 1st grade. I separated the list into things that need labeling with a fine point sharpie and the items our class will share. These should not be labeled. The school will supply the pencils so please do not send any with your child. I hope that your child will have their supplies on the first day as we will be using them then and for the rest of the year.

Things that need to be labeled with your child's name

- ___ 1 box of new crayons (24-36 colors...no more please) Crayola brand is best because they are less breakable. Label with your child's name.
- ___ 4 folders (NOT PEE CHEEs or binders) that are durable, labeled with your child's name on the outside lower right corner
- ___ thin-tipped colored markers (8-16 colors), labeled
- ___ fat-tipped colored markers (8-16 colors), labeled
- ___ 1 pair of good scissors - Fiskars are best, labeled
- ___ 1 backpack big enough to hold a PEE-CHEE folder and other items brought to school on a daily basis
- ___ 1 three-ring binder (1"), no trapper keepers or zippered binders, labeled
- ___ 1 "Kitty Litter Box" or storage box or dishpan that we use as a storage container. Please be sure it's not bigger than 10" X 14" X 3 1/2" or Anything bigger will not fit into our desks, smaller ones will not hold all the desk supplies. PLEASE, NO LIDS!



Items not labeled to be used by the class

- ___ 3 large pink erasers, not labeled
- ___ 4 **LARGE WHITE** glue sticks (small ones dry up too quickly, need to be replaced too frequently and liquid glue is too messy), not labeled
- ___ 1 box of crackers
- ___ 1 large box of kleenex, not labeled
- ___ 1 bottle of Purell (large)

Optional

We use a computer program called Accelerated Math that requires a LOT of paper. If you feel you can afford to do so, 1 or 2 reams of paper would be much appreciated.

3-5 dry erase markers...any colors, not labeled

1 box baggies (zipper type are easiest for 1st graders) 1 or 2 gallon size

Parents, please do not send notebook paper, pencils, trapper keepers, pencil sharpeners, rulers, pencil cases, or anything else not on the list. They become things the students tend to play with and are not needed in class. If your child wants these items, may I suggest you buy them and set up a little desk area at home. This is a good place for your child to have to use for school work. If these items come to school they will be returned home.

Thanks so much for you support. Getting all the proper supplies and having them on the first day sets your child up for success at first grade! I am looking forward to working with your child.
